Three distinct warnings :

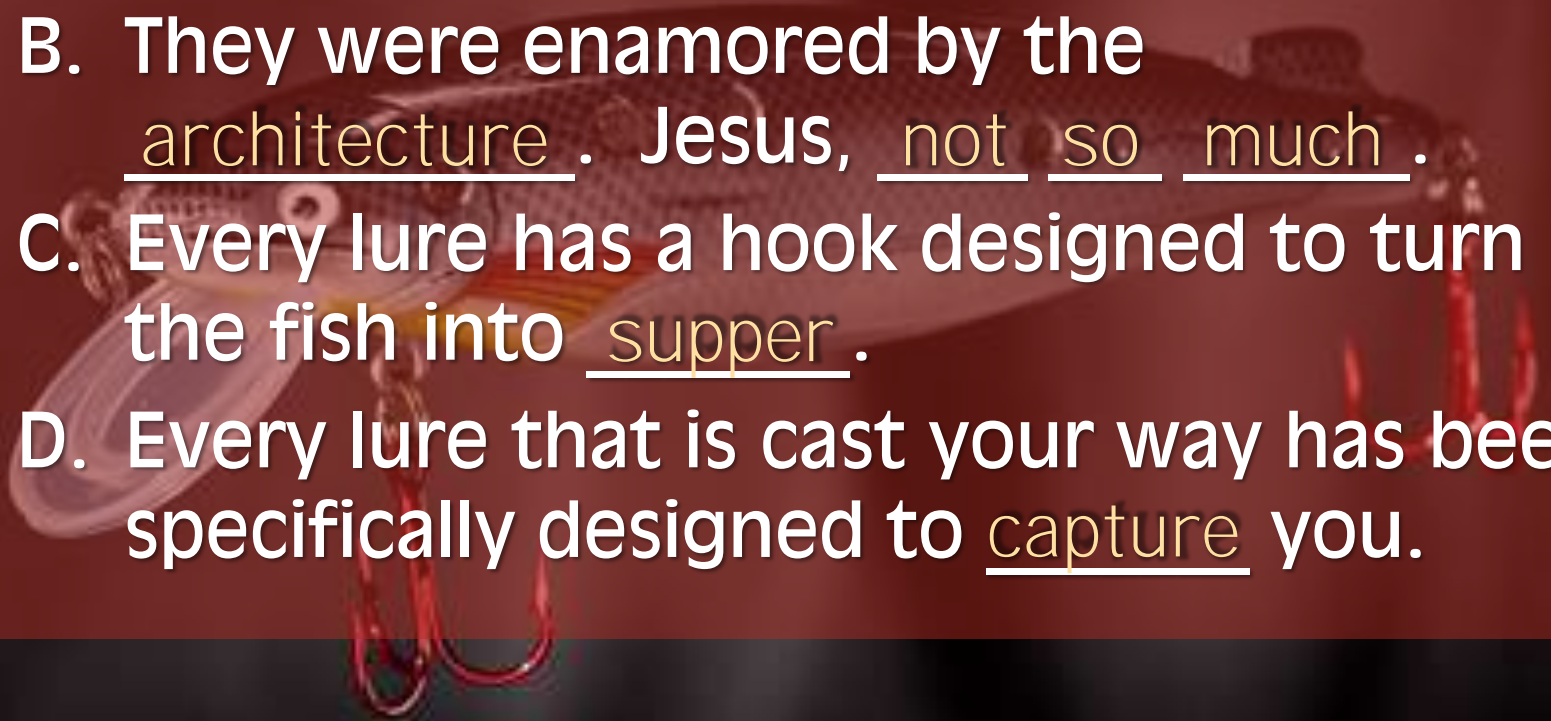
I. The Lure has a hook . Mark 13:1-2

A. A disciple of Jesus should believe , think ,
and behave differently.

B. They were enamored by the
architecture . Jesus, not so much .

C. Every lure has a hook designed to turn
the fish into supper .

D. Every lure that is cast your way has been
specifically designed to capture you.





Three distinct warnings :

II. The Leaves will mature.

A. Four ask Jesus for more. Mark 13:3-4.

B. Jesus trusts them with the truth.
Mark 13:5-31.

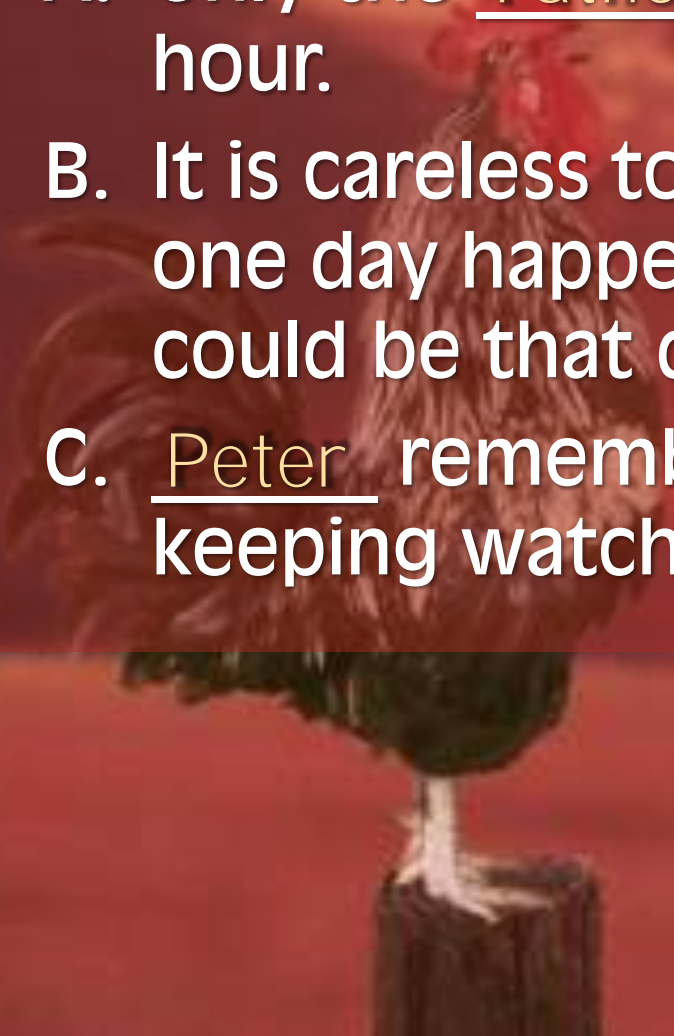
- The end is still to come.
- The return of Jesus is not a metaphor.
- There will be those who twist the truth.
- Being on guard will not keep you from being arrested, persecuted, or betrayed.




Three distinct warnings :


III. The Rooster will crow . Mark 13:32-37

- A. Only the Father knows the day or the hour.
- B. It is careless to know Christ's return will one day happen, but not believe today could be that day.
- C. Peter remembers a crowing rooster, keeping watch, and falling asleep.
